Georg Philipp Telemann (March 14, 1681 – June 25, 1767) was a German Baroque music composer, born in Magdeburg. Selftaught in music, he studied law at the University of Leipzig. Often described as the most prolific composer in history, he was a contemporary of Johann Sebastian Bach, Antonio Vivaldi and a lifelong friend of George Frideric Handel.

Johannes Brahms (May 7, 1833 – April 3, 1897), composer and pianist, was one of the leading musicians of the Romantic period. In his lifetime, Brahms's popularity and influence were considerable; following a comment by Hans von Bülow, he is sometimes grouped with Johann Sebastian Bach and Ludwig van Beethoven as one of the Three Bs.

Walter Leigh (June 22, 1905 – June 12, 1942) was born in Wimbledon, England.

His compositions include several orchestral pieces, chamber music, film and stage music, piano pieces and more. In 1941, he joined the British army and served as a trooper with the Royal Armoured Corps. He was killed in action near Tobruk, Libya in 1942, just before his 37th birthday.

Claude Bolling (born 10 April 1930), is a renowned French jazz pianist, composer, arranger, and occasional actor. He has written music for over one hundred films, mostly French. Bolling is also noted for a series of "crossover" collaborations with classical musicians. His Suite for Flute and Jazz Piano Trio, a mix of Baroque elegance with modern swing, was followed up by other works in the same vein.
